Repeat until all the water has drained, then disconnect the other valve.

To replace your old radiator without needing to alter the pipework, you should choose a radiator with a pipe centre measurement that is as close as possible to the distance between your two pipes. If you're installing a radiator on a wall where there hasn't previously been one, then it's likely you will need to add new pipework as well.

Take your radiator bleed key and open the radiator bleed valve to release any stored pressure. Then close the bleed valve back up again. If your lockshield valve has a drain off, you could at this point drain the radiator from the drain valve. Place a container beneath the valve and turn it anti-clockwise to open it using an adjustable spanner.

How To Change A Radiator Valve Without Draining The System

A radiator replacement should only take a couple of hours. The plumber should bleed and test the radiator system after the installation of the new radiator. It may also be necessary for them to top up the system with water. This depends on how much water you lose in the process of removing the old radiator.

How to Replace a Radiator To remove and replace a radiator you first of all have to drain the water by turning off the valves then unscrewing the cap-nut while holding a bowl under the joint. Then open the bleed valve to let the water drain out slowly until empty.

Slide the nut and olive onto the radiator tail. Locate your water pipe and then slide on the nut and then attach the olive. Take your new radiator valve body and connect it to the water pipe whilst lining it up and inserting it into the radiator tail. This can be a bit fiddly so please be patient.
